# EnercitEE – Part I General overview

## What is EnercitEE?

- EnercitEE is a mini-programme carried out under the EU-programme INTERREG IVC
- EnercitEE seeks to implement EU-targets on energy efficiency practically
- EnercitEE stands for ... **European networks, experience and recommendations helping cities and citizens to become Energy Efficient**

# What is INTERREG IVC?

- INTERREG IVC programme is part of the European Territorial Cooperation Objective of the Structural Fund policies for the period 2007-2013
- INTERREG IVC aims to improve the effectiveness of regional development policies and contribute to economic modernisation and increased competitiveness of Europe
  - bringing forward the EU's strategies of growth, jobs and sustainable development
- It fosters the exchange, sharing and transfer of policy experience, knowledge and good practices between stakeholders (public authorities and citizens) of different European regions

# What is the overall objective of EnercitEE?

**EnercitEE strives for:**

- supporting the European Union goals towards a low-carbon and energy-efficient Europe
- contributing to the improvement of local and regional policies
- providing assistance in the transfer of knowledge on energy efficiency and sustainable transport

## Output:

- Mini-Programme manual, WG/SG meetings, calls for proposals, ranking lists, SP applications, reports (Progress, Regional), assistance to sub-projects & Sub-Project-Participants

# Component 2 – Communication and Dissemination

## Scope:

- Disseminating the projects activities and achievements outside the project
- Benefit other interested local and regional authorities

## Output:

- Logo, flyers, poster exhibitions, website, communication plan, conferences and events

# Component 3 – Exchange of Experience

## Scope:

- Exchange of experience on a strategic level
- Identification and analyses of good practices
- Maximise result implementation outside the project's level
- Go beyond EnercitEE and provide input to other regional and local authorities

## Output:

- Good Practice Guide, Component Seminars, workshops, training sessions, technical and study visit

## Component Manager:

Småland (Kalmar and Kronoberg)/ Blekinge, Sweden

## Component 4 – Sub-projects

### Scope:

- Development of the sub-projects
- Focus on exchange of experience
- Contribution to the improvement of regional/local policies or instruments

### Output:

- Calls for proposals, evaluation, selection and assistance of up to 12 sub-projects

### Component Manager:

CG74 (Haute Savoie, France) for citizens' sub-projects

ASTER (Emilia-Romagna, Italy) for local authorities' sub-projects
