Local news from Pirna in Saxony, DE

In August we introduced in the town administration of Pirna a survey for employees about their mobility behaviour. Fortunately, we got back around 160 completed questionnaires, almost 90%. Currently, the questionnaires are analysed and later we will carry out a workshop. Based on the test phase of our city bus, we submitted a project proposal for further subsidizing the line. First we were taken within the program "Schaufenster Elektromobilität". Now we got the request to submit a qualified subsidy application. Now we look forward to an early start of the line, especially thanks to EnercitEE.

A 2nd edition for the EMW in Cluses, FR

The City of Cluses organized its 2nd edition of the European Mobility Week in September. For this occasion, a new exhibition about the future took place in the City Hall. A "mobility day" has held on the main place of the city on September 22nd. The NGO's Prioriterre and Alvéole shared a stall with the City about ecomobility and an exhibition about alternatives to test different kind of Pedelec.



Focus on electric mobility during Mobility Week in Southeast Sweden!

18 of the 29 municipalities of Southeast Sweden took part in the European Mobility Week. The campaign which runs from 16th to 22nd September every year, is to encourage local authorities to promote sustainable transport towards their citizens. 10 bicycles, cars and segways during the week. A travel habit survey was sent out to 12 000 municipality employees and 60 of them who were car commuters were "recruited" through the survey to test commute with public transportation during a month.
